Gaelynn Lea: Violinist, Composer, and Disability Rights Advocate

Since winning <u>NPR Music's Tiny Desk Contest</u> in 2016, Gaelynn Lea has captivated audiences around the world with her haunting original songs and traditional fiddle tunes. Over the years, she has collaborated with artists such as <u>Michael Stipe</u>, <u>The Decemberists</u>, and the industrial rock supergroup <u>Pigface</u>. In 2022, Gaelynn Lea <u>composed the original score</u> for <u>Macbeth on Broadway</u>, starring Daniel Craig and Ruth Negga. Thanks to a recent <u>Whippoorwill Arts Fellowship</u>, her soundtrack is set to be released in Spring 2025; a *Music from Macbeth* UK album tour will follow soon after.

Gaelynn Lea is a sought-after public speaker about accessibility in the arts. She has been featured on <u>PBS NewsHour</u>, <u>On Being with Krista Tippett</u>, <u>The Moth Radio Hour</u>, <u>The Science of Happiness Podcast</u>, and via two widely-viewed <u>TEDx Talks</u>. In 2024, Gaelynn was awarded the prestigious <u>Disability Futures Fellowship</u> from the Ford and Mellon Foundations, which spotlights the work of disabled creatives across disciplines.

One of Gaelynn Lea's biggest passions is promoting Disability Culture. To that end, she co-founded <u>RAMPD</u> [Recording Artists and Music Professionals with Disabilities] with NYC-based recording artist <u>Lachi</u> in early 2022. The mission of this fast-growing global network of disabled music professionals is to <u>amplify Disability Culture</u>, <u>promote</u> <u>equitable inclusion</u> & <u>advocate for accessibility</u> in the music industry.

Most recently, Gaelynn Lea co-wrote, acted, and sang in a new musical fable for the stage called *Invisible Fences* with disabled storyteller <u>Kevin Kling</u>. This fantastical, music-filled production touches on disability, identity, and the storytelling. Gaelynn also helped to develop and now co-directs the <u>Music Inclusion Ensemble</u> with fellow disabled musicians <u>Adrian Anantawan</u> and <u>Molly Joyce</u>. Their mission is to create a more explicit culture around classical music and disability and to perform a diverse repertoire of music by disabled composers.

Currently, Gaelynn Lea is writing a book about her touring adventures & disability advocacy that has been acquired by <u>Algonquin Books</u> and will be published late next year. *Linger in the Sun* is a love-letter to every body; a warm, funny and deeply-felt memoir about disability, music, and the messy creativity of an artist's life.
